

It's an oft used phrase that if you cut someone from Alliance in half, they would ooze smoked paprika and chorizo oil, such is our obsession with Spain. We're well known for championing the rising stars, the passionate artisans, the terroirists, the drivers of the new Spain. But every journey has a beginning, and like many Spanish obsessives, ours began in Rioja.

A love affair

Longer ago than I care to recall, my love affair with Spain started when I was lucky enough to win a scholarship to travel to Spain, courtesy of Freixenet. I was met off the flight into Bilbao by José Madrazo, a legendary figure in the history of the iconic Rioja producers Cune & Contino. I vividly remember the smell of rich, leathery tobacco as I took my first steps into the real Spain of the 1990s and I slowly but

surely fell in love with the country and its wines. That love for the country, sparked by the warmth and generous hospitality of my hosts, was to become a defining part of a large part of my career in wine.

At the time, there were few good Spanish restaurants in the UK and so, in contrast to Italy and France, Spain had a few very specialist champions of their wines. There was no one like Alliance, and so the opportunity arose to build a Spanish presence that would help create the DNA of the business over the following decades.

One of our longest standing producers, <u>Luis Cañas</u>, was also going through of a bit of an epiphany and through a fortuitous combination of serendipity and clever portfolio.

Those early days, and to be honest, all the years following pre COVID, were characterised by frequent visits to Cañas where the feeling of family, of generosity, spirit and commitment led to an enduring love for all that they do.

I think that we were all struck, not just by the beauty of the region and its wines but how food was inextricably sown in to the patchwork of their lives. Whether it was the jamon iberico de bellota (that we became known for carving at all of our tastings long before it became de-rigeur) or the melting milk fed lamb of restaurants like Terete, the vast Txuleton of Sagartoki in Vitoria or the simple delights of the menestra de verdura served at Casa Cañas, the wines and foods of Rioja slowly became part of us, quite literally.

Rioja from a different angle

Many years have passed, and my travels have taken me to Australia, where my love for the Spanish variety Garnacha has stood me in good stead. In that time, Rioja has changed too. Families like the Cañas' pioneered the way forward by moving from fruit growers to winemakers and have helped inspire a new generation to seek out the best fruit, identify the best plots within the iconic villages and eschew the domination of both big brands and excessive oak that has, at times, limited the potential of this great region.

At <u>deAlto</u>, we have taken some of what I have learned in Australia, placing Garnacha front and centre, letting the vineyard and fruit speak fluently, but also respecting the history of Rioja while helping to frame its future.

Focusing on the real strength of Rioja Oriental, Garnacha, we work with the best fruit, picked while energetic and vivid and treated in the winery with minimal intervention, and importantly, larger and less domineering oak presence. It's a way forward for us, but just another small piece of the remarkably detailed, complex, delicious and beautiful tapestry that is Rioja.

Alliance Wine sells over 1.8 million litres of Rioja per year. This trend was down in 2020 but 2021 so far has seen a 33% increase on sales on last year.
